





Rose & Victor Rifkin Family Scholarship – first-generation U.S. citizen with professional aspirations (New – two at \$1,000)





Faculty Innovation Grants: 161 teachers, counselors, deans, club advisors, and other faculty across CRLS and Rindge School of Technical Arts (RSTA) programs since 2007 have received grants of up to \$1,000 each to energize the learning experience for their students.

54 fellows since 2010 have received awards up to \$1,000 toward international and domestic school-authorized trips that broaden horizons and expand minds.

Unsung Heroes Awards: 448 awards – 16 each

academic term – have been presented to students

showing outstanding character along with other positive contributions to the school climate, including citizenship, studentship, community service, leadership, and academic improvement at commencement.

The “It Takes a Village” College Success Program (ITAV): 200 students since 2012 have benefited from our college and career success program, which has promoted CRLS graduates' achievement with placement test prep, the support of alumni and community career mentors, a college coach, and scholarships through the college years.

Faculty Distinction Awards: 40 faculty members have been honored since 2007; each year, four are selected by graduating seniors to honor at commencement for positive impact made on their years at CRLS.


