



Dear CRLS Families,





**Scholarships** are presented to members of each graduating class. Starting with two scholarships to the Class of '10 and building up to 24 scholarships and graduate awards to the Class of '15, FoCRLS has presented over \$48,000 to more than 50 graduates so far! We are currently developing a fund with the goal of an additional \$10,000 annually through a partnership with the Cambridge business community.

**Student Travel Fellowships** have made educational trips possible for 42 students to France, Spain, El Salvador, Panama, Turkey, the Dominican Republic, The Island School in the Bahamas, the Galapagos Islands, London, and New York City. Travelers have experienced community service, international relations, politics, marine biology, ecology, theater, music, history, geography, languages, and cultures.

**Faculty Innovation Grants** provide funds to enrich curriculum and provide services and creative opportunities to students. To date, 150 teachers, counselors, librarians and club advisors have received grants of up to \$1,000 each for creative projects and enhancements in every department of CRLS and RTSA.

The "It Takes a Village" College Success Program (ITAV) has supported approximately 180 CRLS graduates with preparation, scholarships, a college counselor, and career mentors. This year's program will focus on the expansion of our Alumni and Community Mentoring Program.

**Unsung Heroes** are selected by teachers, deans, and counselors based upon their academic progress, citizenship, stewardship, and leadership. One student from each Learning Community from each grade is honored each term. Since 2008, 400 Heroes have been recognized!

**Faculty Distinction Awards** give graduating seniors the opportunity to nominate and celebrate four of the teachers and staff who have made the most significant contribution to their learning and growth while at CRLS. Since 2007, 36 teachers and staff members have been honored.
